Junior Advisory Group (JAG)

Purpose

The Junior Advisory Group (JAG):

In 2023, one JAG meeting took place. The second quarter's meeting did not go ahead due to the vacancy of the Children and Young People Engagement/Safety Officer position.

The JAG meeting was held on Wednesday 1 November 2023, at the Civic Centre in Glen Waverley. Cr Luo and Cr Paterson attended and were joined by 22 students from five Monash primary schools. The young people raised questions about Council processes, decision making, sustainability and infrastructure.

The Junior Advisory Group will continue in 2024.

Multicultural Advisory Committee

Purpose

Achievements for 2023

In 2023, the MYC undertook the following:

- Provided a written submission to council for the proposed Glen Waverley Precinct.
- Explored the measures Monash Council are adopting to improve inclusiveness of sport for Women and LGBTIQA+ community.
- Explored the concept of 'Future Thinking' with Monash University students.
- Explored Monash Council's Sustainable Period Project and measures to improve community education for young people.
- Participated in a gambling addiction workshop with The Sides of the Coin and provided feedback from a young person's perspective.
- Two members presented their families migration story at the Monash Connects multicultural dinner.

Members for endorsement or reappointment

During 2023 MYC received nine resignations. These resignations predominately related to committee members increasing work, school, or university commitments. These members have been active and valuable representatives through their involvement in and contribution to MYC in 2023: Mr Ramike Wickramasinghe, Mr Jonathan Lee, Ms Eva Mohan, Mr Raghav Baheti, Mr Kabisan Sutharsan, Ms Serene Karunaratne, Ms Shreeya Kalagotla, Ms Neha Satishkumar and Mr Miranpal Nagra.

To fill vacancies, the MYC continually seeks membership from young people aged 15 – 25 who live, go to school, or work in the City of Monash. In 2023 Ms Annie Zhou, Mr Tyson Hudson, Mr Thomas Maguire-Nguyen, Mr Arjun Kapoor, Ms Sabrina Cheng, Ms Fiona Zhang, Ms Sasmi De Silva, Mr Harindra Krishnamendu, Ms Tarini Guddanti, Ms Shishta Jain and Ms Chandani Patel were successful in their application for MYC, subject to Council's endorsement.

As a result of the resignations and appointments in this report, the group will have 20 endorsed members of young people. Currently, there is one place available for a new MYC member in 2024.

More resignations from MYC are expected at the end of the year.

Clayton Activity Centre Committee

Purpose

The purpose of the Clayton Activity Centre Committee is to provide high level advice and input into major projects and Council strategies in Clayton, including implications for Council arising from the Suburban Rail Loop project in Clayton and near Monash University, and be a conduit for consultation and engagement between Council and the Clayton Traders Association, local residents and other traders and key stakeholders in Clayton.

The Committee will assist Council to make the most of current and future opportunities for improving the amenity and liveability of Clayton as a place to work, rest, study and play. It is important for Council as a landowner and the local planning authority to take a coordinated approach and ensure that the Clayton Activity Centre can continue to grow and be vibrant.

Committee Composition

The Committee comprises the Oakleigh Ward Councillors. Councillor Fergeus has been appointed Chair of the Committee until the current Council term ends.

Objectives

The committee will look at matters such as:

- SRL Precinct Planning and impacts from SRL works
- Better amenity in town centre and improvements
- Trucks on Clayton Road and parking matters

Frequency of Meeting

The Committee meets every two months or as needed. It is proposed that alternate meetings will be held either in person, in Clayton or on-line. The committee has only met once so far.

Glen Waverley Activity Centre Committee

Purpose

The purpose of the Glen Waverley Activity Centre Committee is to provide high level advice, direction and input into major Council and State Government projects and strategic policy initiatives for the Glen Waverley Activity Centre (GWAC).

The key areas of focus for the preceding 12 months include:

- The Suburban Rail Loop Project
- The extension to the Bogong Car Park
- Car parking with the Glen Waverley Activity Centre
- The Glen Waverley Civic Precinct Project
- The redevelopment and reinvigoration of Kingsway (with an increased focus on pedestrians and outdoor dining).

These areas will continue to be the focus for the Committee for the next 12 months.

Objectives

The objectives of the GWAC Committee are:

- Provide input and advice to Council on opportunities, Council and State Government driven strategic development issues and major projects in the Activity Centre.
- Actively support and assist Council's consultation with, engagement and advocacy to the State Government, relevant stakeholders and the broader community in relation to the GWAC.
- Assist with shaping and encouraging a reinvigorated Kingsway streetscape which prioritises pedestrians, outdoor dining and other activity over cars.
- Recommend to Council appropriate projects or development opportunities for the GWAC.
- Assist Council in determining priorities and strategic directions for the Activity Centre.

Committee Composition

The Committee comprises of the Mayor and the Glen Waverley Ward Councillors.

One of the Committee members will be appointed to chair the Committee. This appointment will be made by either the Council or the Mayor. It will be supported by the Chief Executive Officer, Director City Development, Director Community Services and other officers as required.

Frequency of Meeting

The Committee meets on a monthly basis or as needed.

Oakleigh Activity Centre Steering Committee

Purpose

The purpose of the Oakleigh Activity Centre Steering Committee (OACSC) is to provide high level advice and input into major Council and State Government projects for the Oakleigh Activity Centre.

The key areas of focus for the preceding 12 months include:

- Haughton Road Public Realm Feasibility Study
- Oakleigh Activity Centre Safe Pedestrian Project
- Huntingdale Structure Plan
- Atkinson Street Cycleway Consultation

Some of these areas will continue to be the focus for the Committee for the next 12 months.

Objectives

The objectives of the OACSC are:

- Provide input and advice to Council on opportunities, Council and State Government major projects in the Activity Centre.
- Actively support and assist Council's consultation with engagement and advocacy to the State Government, relevant stakeholders and the broader community in relation to the Activity Centre.
- Recommend to Council appropriate projects or development opportunities for the OACSC.

Frequency of Meeting

Councillors Stuart James, Josh Fergeus and Theo Zographos were the Council representatives for 2023.

The OACSC continued to meet on an as-needed basis and met on four occasions during 2023.

At its 25 October 2023 meeting, the OACSC determined future meetings in 2024 to be bi-monthly.
