4.1 TENDER FOR MONASH OPERATIONS CENTRE FIRE SERVICE UPGRADE (CF2023100: TB)

Responsible Director: Jarrod Doake, Director City Services

RECOMMENDATION*

That Council:

- 1. Awards the tender from Kennedys Group Services Pty Ltd for the Monash Operations Centre Fire Service Upgrade, Contract No. 2023100 for a fixed Lump Sum of \$735,053 with an extra \$84,700 for Contingencies, PM fees of \$16,500 and \$27,500 for Design Fees;
- 2. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to execute the contract agreement;
- 3. Notes that the contract is anticipated to commence on 1 May 2023 and the expected completion date is 20 September 2023;
- 4. Approves the additional budget required in 2023/24 of \$363,000 to complete the project and that this is included in the adoption of the 2023/24 Budget; and
- 5. Notes that the anticipated project expenditure including the fixed Lump Sum, Project Management/Delivery Fees and Provisional Items is \$785,954.40 with a further sum of \$84,700 for Contingencies.

INTRODUCTION

Council has conducted a tender for 2023100 - Monash Operations Centre Fire Service Upgrade.

As part of its planning process for this tender, Council Officers considered its procurement options including whether to go to market itself, participate in regional or sector collaboration or to access established contracts via other compliant Procurement agreements. As this project is standalone within the Monash Operations Centre/Waste transfer Station site, there was no opportunity to participate in regional or sector collaboration with other Councils.

BACKGROUND

The Monash Operations Centre Fire Service (also servicing the Waste Transfer Station) is at its end of life requiring renewal. In planning for the renewal, Council Officers engaged Perry Consulting engineers to undertake an investigation and provides a risk assessment of the existing system and designs a new fire service system to conform with current regulations and protect the facility and its users.

NOTIFICATION

A public notice was placed in The Age newspaper on 4 March 2023 and the tender closed on 22 March 2023.

Tender submissions were received from the following two suppliers by the appointed closing time.

DISCUSSION

The final evaluation ranking (including the price and non-price evaluation criteria) had Kennedys Group Services Pty Ltd ranked highest and as such, the evaluation panel recommends Kennedys Group Services Pty Ltd as representing the best value outcome for Council. Kennedys Group specialises in this type of contract, they have previously successfully delivered contracts for Council including the Monash Operations Centre workshop roof replacement and the South Oakleigh Bowling Club Asbestos removal and re-roofing project. Kennedys Group has also delivered similar fire service contracts as follows:

- Geelong Port, Installation of compliant fire service.
- Bendigo Kagan Institute, Fire service replacement including design, installation, and commissioning.
- Banyule City Council, Depot Fire service upgrade.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Provision has been made to deliver this project across two financial years as detailed below. Although the 2023/24 Budget will not be formerly adopted by Council until its 27 June 2023 Council Meeting, these works are renewal/compliance works, are categorised as Non-Discretionary and provision has already been made within Council's Long Term Financial Plan to deliver prioritised renewal works of this type.
