4.1 TENDER FOR DESIGN SERVICES – DORRINGTON DRIVE, WARD AVENUE AND ASHWOOD MEMORIAL EARLY YEARS CENTRES

RECOMMENDATION*

That Council:

- Awards the tender from AOA Christopher Peck Pty Ltd, for Design Services

 Dorrington Drive, Ward Avenue & Ashwood Memorial Early Years
 Centres, Contract No. 2023120 for a fixed Lump Sum of \$761,105.26 with an extra \$77,000 for Contingencies.
- 2. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to execute the contract agreement.
- 3. Notes that the anticipated project expenditure including the fixed Lump Sum, Contingencies, and Project Management / Delivery Fees is \$864,505.

INTRODUCTION

Council has conducted a tender for CF2023120 – Design Services – Dorrington Drive, Ward Avenue and Ashwood Memorial Early Years Centres.

As part of its planning process for this tender, Council Officers considered its procurement options, including whether to go to market itself, participate in regional or sector collaboration or to access established contracts via other compliant Procurement agreements.

Due to the similar scoped design projects and the constrained timelines as part of the external funding source, Council Officers agreed to package up three design projects into the one tender for a more efficient design process.

BACKGROUND

Council invited Tenders for the Design Services for the Dorrington Child and Family Hub in Mount Waverley, Ward Avenue Kindergarten in Oakleigh South and Ashwood Memorial Kindergarten refurbishment and extension in Ashwood, as per the Scope of Services & Functional Design Brief.

The three projects are partially funded by the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) with Council to contribute the remaining funds for these projects.

The works include engaging a Primary Consultant (Architectural) to design and document all three projects for all stages through to construction completion and handover.

The scope of design works include:

Dorrington Child and Family Hub

- Demolition of existing facility
- 2 x Kindergarten rooms
- 1 x Multipurpose room
- 4 x Baby rooms
- 1 x Parents lounge
- 1 x MCH Office
- Associated ancillary Spaces
- Outdoor education landscape

Ward Avenue Kindergarten

- Demolition of existing facility
- 2 x kindergarten rooms (33 places each)
- 1 x Office
- 1 x Staff room
- Associated ancillary Spaces
- Outdoor education landscape

Ashwood Memorial Kindergarten Refurbishment and Extension

- Existing facility refurbishment
- 2 x kindergarten rooms (33 places each)
- 1 x Office
- 1 x Staff room
- Associated ancillary spaces and landscaping

NOTIFICATION

Eight (8) prequalified suppliers from the Department of Treasury and Finance Construction Supplier Register (CSR) were invited to participate in a selective Tender for this project on 28 January 2023 and the tender closed on 17 February 2023. Council's use of the CSR list is approved under Council's Procurement Policy.

DISCUSSION

The final evaluation ranking (including the price and non-price evaluation criteria) had AOA Christopher Peck Pty Ltd, for Early Years - Design Services - Dorrington Drive, Ward, Avenue & Ashwood Memorial Early Years Centre's, ranked highest and as such, the evaluation panel recommends AOA Christopher Peck Pty Ltd as representing the best value outcome for Council.

They scored highly across all evaluation criteria with strong experience and resources. They provided a program that meets the tight timeframe to complete the design and enable construction of the facility ready for operation in January 2025.

AOA Christopher Peck have designed similar facilities for various Government and Education departments. They recently successfully completed design work for the Wellington Family Hub, and the Pinewood Family Hub for Council within time and budget.

As such, the evaluation panel recommends these suppliers as representing the best value outcome for Council.

AOA Christopher Peck has one staff member residing in the City of Monash. They will procure goods and materials within City of Monash where feasible.

3. Social Sustainability:

AOA Christopher Peck have a strong focus on Social Sustainability including a 1% donation of yearly profits to a selected non-for-profit organization. They also engage social enterprise cleaning services and office fruit supplies to their Head office facility.
