

#### **Proposed Species Options**

#### Option 1 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

### Tristaniopsis laurina 'Luscious' (Luscious Kanooka)

Power line side and Non-Power line side





This native tree has a dense foliage canopy with glossy green leaves that are oblong shaped. Yellow flowers are borne in Summer and are abundant with nectar attracting birds. Smooth creamy trunk streaked with grey.

Mature Size (h x w): 8 x 4m

Form: Oval

Option 2 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

### Eucalyptus leucoxylon 'Euky Dwarf" (Dwarf Yellow Gum)

Power line side and Non-Power line side





This shapely dwarf Eucalypt has a light, open canopy with a single trunk and smooth bark that sheds. Its greygreen leaves once mature are offset by masses of nectar rich, pink, red and sometimes cream blossoms from late autumn to early summer, attracting native birds to the garden.

**Mature Size (h x w):** 6-8 x 4-6m

Form: Round

## Option 3 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

### Cupaniopsis anacardioides (Tuckeroo)

Power line side and Non-Power line side





Medium sized native tree with a rounded habit and spreading crown. Dense green foliage flushes bright green in the warmer months. Yellowgreen spring flowers are followed by ornamental berries containing showy orange seed pods.

Mature Size (h x w): 8-10 x 6-8m

Form: Round
