

#### **Proposed Species Options**

#### Option 1 – Combination of Species

#### Tristaniopsis laurina 'Luscious' (Luscious Kanooka)

Power line side



This native tree has a dense foliage canopy with glossy green leaves that are oblong shaped. Yellow flowers are borne in summer and are abundant with nectar, attracting birds. Smooth creamy trunk streaked with grey.

Mature Size (h x w): 8 x 4m

Form: Oval

#### Lophostemon confertus (Queensland Brush Box)

Non-power line side



This dome-headed tree has a dense, glossy green canopy, great salmon coloured bark that peels in summer. It flowers in summer forming small white clusters.

Mature Size (h x w): 10 x 15m

Form: Oval

## Option 2 – Single species (both sides of the street)

# Brachychiton populneus x acerifolius 'Bella Pink' (Bella Pink Hybrid Brachychiton)

Power line and non-power line side



This is a small to medium-sized shade tree offering glossy green foliage and pretty clusters of salmon pink, bell-shaped flowers in summer. As a grafted tree, it is more compact in size which makes it highly suitable for domestic landscapes. Flowers attract birds.

Mature Size (h x w): 8 x 4m

Form: Broad domed

## Option 3 – Single species (both sides of the street)

## Hymenosporum flavum (Native Frangipani)

Power line and non-power line side





Commonly known as the native Frangipani, although not related to the exotic form, this tree bears highly fragrant flower clusters that start out cream and turn to yellow. Its flowers are great for attracting birds and native bees. We have found that in southern areas of Australia it performs best planted in the ground rather than in pots.

Mature Size (h x w): 6-8 x 5-6

Form: Oval
