# 1. Background

### 1.1 Purpose

The Monash Football (Soccer) Plan has been developed in collaboration between Council, Monash football clubs and Football Victoria to establish key principles and strategically address important issues through the development of an action plan to guide the future of football in Monash.

It is important to note that the Monash Football (Soccer) Plan is aspirational, and it is acknowledged that not all actions may be achieved in the life of the plan. However, we feel that this plan has us well-positioned to receive external funding and tap into opportunities that may present for the sport in future years.

## 1.2 Objectives

- Identify short, medium and long term investment priorities for football pitches in Monash.
- Ensure that football is a sport that is available and accessible for the whole Monash community to enjoy.
- Adequately service different levels and standards of football in Monash.
- Ensure that Monash football clubs support active participation and community health and wellbeing.

## 2.3 Key Findings

The data captured as part of the methodology outlined in section 2.2 has provided us with a strong evidence base to develop actions for the Monash Football (Soccer) Plan. Key findings include:



#### Infrastructure

4 out of 24 football pitches meet preferred floodlighting standards

21 out of 24 pitches have deficient drainage and irrigation systems

Synthetic cricket wickets are placed inside 7 out of 24 Monash football pitches



#### **Participation**

Females make up just 16% of senior football participation in Monash

Only 41% of Monash residents that play football do so with a Monash-based club

Junior participation in Monash (14%) is lower than national averages



#### **Forum**

"Poor condition of grounds and lighting are the most critical issues facing clubs"

"Activate existing venues to their full potential with higher quality facilities"

"Strive for increased participation and inclusiveness in clubs"



### Discussion Paper Responses

80% support investment into existing and established football venues

76% support all Monash football clubs committing to increased inclusiveness

Condition of facilities, Participation and Sustainable Clubs were the top 3 most popular investment principles
