## **MOTION**

That Council:

- 1. Reaffirms its status as a Refugee Welcome Zone City.
- 2. Joins with Australia's international aid organisations, faith groups, unions, other Councils, and community organisations in proudly supporting The Palm Sunday Walk for Justice for Refugees.

## BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The preamble to the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights calls on "every individual and every organ of society" to promote and respect human rights.

Council is an important organisation in the community and plays a vital role providing leadership on a range of substantive issues.

The Palm Sunday Walk for Justice for Refugees is in support of a fair society that welcomes refugees. The next Walk will take place on Sunday 14 April, 2019.

The City of Monash has made a commitment to welcoming refugees into the community, upholding the human rights of refugees, and demonstrating compassion for refugees as a result of signing the Refugee Welcome Zone Declaration in 2002. Council should therefore support The Palm Sunday Walk for Justice for Refugees in line with these commitments.

This report is in line with Council's commitment to multiculturalism and to the principles of human rights, access and equity and social justice. In practice Monash Council has demonstrated this commitment through the following initiatives:
