- 2. Authorises the Chief Financial Officer or his delegate to execute the contract agreement; and
- 3. Notes that the contract will commence on 1st April 2020, with an initial term of three (3) years and the contract has two (2) separate extension options of one (1) year each and authorises the Chief Financial Officer to approve extension options subject to satisfactory performance.

INTRODUCTION

Council has tendered for First Aid Services

BACKGROUND

Strategic Procurement brought together stakeholders from across Council to review first aid training needs to achieve best value and consistent outcomes for Council. The three main training qualifications needed were Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation training (HLTAID001), First Aid Training (HLTAID003) and Advanced Resuscitation training (HLTAID007) along with the option for other relevant training courses to be priced in the schedule of rates.

It was also agreed to include service options for (i) database management of training records and (ii) Mental Health First Aid training for staff.

NOTIFICATION

A public notice was placed in The Age newspaper on 11/1/2020 and the tender closed on 31/1/2020.
