Oakleigh Activity Centre Advisory Group

Purpose

Key initiatives

During 2020 the committee has been involved in:

Increasing Places to Rest - Development of a process to map existing and additional seating across all the 32 grid zones in Monash. Undertook a mapping exercise that is currently being merged into a central spreadsheet to be added to the Council GIS mapping system.

Loneliness Framework - Feedback provided to Community Strengthening on the impact of Ageing and Loneliness.

Feedback and Advice on Social Inclusion Programs - Provide feedback on the key activities and make suggestions to support council staff in the delivery of the Positive Ageing Lifestyle (PALS) program and the Monash Seniors Festival program.

Zoom Meetings - During COVID-19 lockdown members were supported by Council staff to attend Zoom meetings. Increasing confidence, awareness and knowledge of Tech savvy skills.

Positive Ageing Directory - Review and provide feedback on the newly developed Positive Ageing Directory to be launched in early 2021 as a resource for older residents to connect with their community.

Representation - One member was selected by the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) to be on the Victorian Commissioner for Seniors Victorian Senior Advisory Group by the Director, Seniors Programs and Participation Seniors, Ageing and Carers Branch, Health and Wellbeing Division.

Monash University Initiative - Monash Council has partnered with Monash University in their bid for an Industrial Transformation Training Centre in Optimal Ageing. PARG Members invited to be on the Monash University Optimising Ageing Centre focus group.

Feedback and advice

- Provide advice/feedback and ideas on social inclusion opportunities to be planned and organised in the Positive Ageing Lifestyle Program – PALS.
- Support with the evaluation of the Age Friendly Action in the Integrated Health Plan.
- Provided feedback on the Loneliness Framework in relation to older residents.

Positive Ageing Seniors Network Forum

Purpose

The Seniors Forum provides an opportunity for any committee member of a seniors group and staff from local not-for-profit service providers (i.e. South East Volunteer Service, Neighbourhood House) to find out the latest news from Council on matters such as community grants, halls management, Age Friendly update and opportunities to be involved and Council initiatives. There is no interview or selection process to attend this forum as it is not an official advisory group.

The purpose of the Positive Ageing Seniors Network Forum is to meet with key Council staff from various departments to be informed by Council on various issues that may be relevant to their group, club or organisation.

Numbers and groups that are represented at each forum meeting are varied depending on their availability, including Councillors. There is no term for the community membership to attend and no appointment of community members by Council.

The Positive Ageing Seniors Network Forum typically meets three times per calendar year, however during COVID-19 all meetings were suspended due to lockdown. One meeting was hosted by Zoom in November 2020, which covered a range of matters:

- Community Grants update
- Community Halls update
- Age Friendly update
- Positive Ageing Lifestyle, Seniors Festival and Social Inclusion update
- Councillor update
- Group updates

Monash Youth Committee

Purpose

The Monash Youth Committee (MYC) is an inclusive group of young people, committed to creating greater connections between young people and Monash Council. MYC discuss and take action on issues affecting young people living in the City of Monash.

The Committee has two broad objectives:

- a) To function as a consultation panel of young people that provides input into the development of Council policy and planning frameworks.
- b) To act as a conduit for the positive promotion of young people's ideas and achievements.

Achievements for 2020

The MYC continued to meet monthly during 2020, initially face to face, then when COVID restrictions were introduced, via video conferencing platforms. This provided both an opportunity for Council and other organisations to consult with the committee on various topics as well as an opportunity for the members to develop their skills and have a voice about the issues important to the young people in Monash.

In 2020, the MYC has undertaken the following:

- Had a past member, Dr Mizna Shahbaz, talk to the group about COVID anxiety, providing clear facts about COVID-19 and how individuals can minimise risk. She also spoke about self-care and looking after family and friends. This presentation occurred in May 2020. Committee members reported that they appreciated the presentation and subsequent discussion.
- Undertook media training facilitated by the Youth Affairs Council of Victoria (YACVIC) providing members of the committee with the opportunity to learn how young people can have a stronger voice through the media. Five members put their names forward for further training so that they could join a pool of YACVIC young people who are media trained and interested in being interviewed on youth related issues.
- In November 2020 a member of MYC, Evonne Lu, was announced as one of 31 finalists and representing the City of Monash in the *Takeover Melbourne* storytelling competition. *Takeover Melbourne* is a new initiative from the ABC in partnership with VicHealth, Resilient Melbourne and the Centre for Multicultural Youth, amplifying the voices of young Melburnians (aged 12 to 18 years).
- Wrote a letter Federal MP's to voice their concerns on behalf of Monash Young people in regards to changes made to the Higher Education Support Amendment (Job-Ready Graduates and Supporting Regional and Remote Students) Bill 2020.
- After being actively involved in advocating for a *headspace* service in Monash, have continued to support the project with some members continuing active representation in the co-design meetings for Monash's *headspace* Syndal development.

The current working groups for MYC are:

- a) Environment
- b) Community Engagement

The Environment Group facilitated a social media ECO Challenge where community members were encouraged to complete nine environmentally friendly challenges including, ride, recycle, repair and plant something. The project was promoted on youth services social media and had 14 entries where community members provided photos of themselves completing challenges.

The Community Engagement Group developed a range of social media activities promoting fun and inclusion during lock down. The Community Engagement Group facilitated eight online quizzes with an engagement of more than 150 people and the also developed a 30-day Health and Wellbeing challenge for youth services social media.

Members for endorsement or reappointment

At the end of 2020 MYC received nine resignations, predominately related to committee members increasing work, school or university commitments. These members have been active and valuable representatives of young people through their involvement in and contribution to MYC: Ms Vrinda Mahesh, Mr Karthik Muralim, Ms Tatyana Wilson, Ms Anna Zhang, Ms Shriya Gupta, Mr Ani Prakash, Ms Veronica Levey, Mr Darren Chee and Ms Laura Wang.

To fill vacancies, the MYC continually seeks membership from young people aged 15 – 25 who live, go to school, or work in the City of Monash. Mr Jonathan Lee, Mr Jacob Biviano, Mr Raghav Baheti, Mr Vibhu Desilva and Mr Alan Wang were successful in their application for MYC subject to Council's endorsement.

As a result of the resignations and appointments in this report the group will have 16 endorsed members of young people. Currently there are five places available for new MYC members in 2021.
