Breat things ahead... Monash

As we look forward to a new year and a new decade, it's a good time to update you on the great things happening in Monash.

Work is progressing on the redevelopment of the Oakleigh Recreation Centre, transforming the facility into an integrated multi-purpose sports precinct. The facility will feature five new basketball courts and a gym upgrade. It will also be the new home for a regional level gymnastics facility for the Waverley Gymnastic Club. While work continues on the redevelopment, the Oakleigh outdoor pool has re-opened for the summer season.

We'll be undertaking further upgrades of playspaces across Monash creating fun and interesting places for children to explore. The Wellesley Road Reserve playspace in Glen Waverley is due to open mid next year and is a first for Monash, featuring sensory play activities to stimulate young children's sense of touch, smell, taste, sight and hearing.

Other playspace upgrades include Carlson Reserve (Clayton), Danien Street (Glen Waverley) and Wilma Avenue (Mulgrave).

And we're continuing with our core work of upgrading drainage, footpaths and roads across Monash and maintaining our valued parks and reserves.

The new multi-sport pavilion at Caloola Reserve (Oakleigh) is at the design phase and work on this project will start early next year, featuring hot shots tennis courts and a basketball court creating a new sporting precinct in this well-used local area.

We'll also be embarking on some upgrades to the Glen Waverley library toilets, change rooms at MARC and introducing a food waste recycling service in July that will allow for food scraps disposed of in the green lid bin to be turned into compost.

Household recycling secure in Monash for another three years

e^{a'} Household recycling in Monash is locked in for the next three years (to April 2023) after Council secured its contract with provider Visy Recycling.

While many Councils have been forced to dispose of their recyclables in landfill or stockpile the collections following the closure of recycling operators, Monash is pleased to have been able to maintain its service throughout the recycling crisis.

Monash has maintained a longstanding partnership with Visy for the past eight years and the new contract gives the community assurance that their recycling will not go to landfill.

The recycling landscape in Australia has changed dramatically in the past 18 months and there has been much uncertainty for Councils and the communities they serve.

We are pleased we can let you know that you have security about your recycling being picked up every

fortnight and that it is being processed for recycling.

We encourage Monash residents to keep recycling and look at ways to reduce their household waste and adopt more sustainable practices, no matter how small, in their daily lives.

Council will continue to advocate to the State Government for the introduction of a Container Deposit Scheme to reduce litter, improve recycling quality and minimise glass bottles from the recycling bin.

Approximately 14,300 tonnes of recycling is collected from Monash household recycling services each year.

Solo Resource Recovery will continue to collect our kerbside bins, including recycling that will be delivered to Visy's facility in Springvale.

Ian is a passionate wildlife photographer whose work engages people in nature so they get to know the amazing animals that share our urban environment.

Growing up on the rural fringes of Melbourne, Ian spent his days in the bush or by the creek and "developed a deep and abiding love of the bush and an appreciation of the diversity of life that surrounds us all."

He generously shares his images free of charge, with the aim of connecting people to the incredible beauty that is right on our doorstep.

"With the urbanised life most of us lead these days, we are becoming less and less connected with the natural world," Ian said.

"In a small way, I hope that my photos may help to restore some of the connection, especially if the subject is local."

By bringing these creatures to life, Ian shares his love of wildlife with the residents of Monash and through this raises awareness of their existence and the need to protect their habitat. His imagery has featured in numerous Council publications, as well as those by other organisations.

Helping people to learn is what I want to do," lan said.

Register 7000 your pool and spa

All owners of existing swimming pools and spas now need to register their pool with Council.

The State Government has introduced changes to safety barriers and fencing around private swimming pools and spas to reduce incidences of young children drowning.

The new regulations started on 1 December 2019 and you have until 1 June 2020 to register.

Here is an update on several developments proposed, approved or refused in Monash.

- » A new application has been received for 445-467 Blackburn Road, Mount Waverley (The Bruce County site) proposing a multilevel building up to seven storeys in height with two basements (252 car parks) for a retirement village and childcare centre.
- An application has been lodged for a five storey building including two shops and 15 apartments at 55-59 Portman Street Oakleigh.
- » A proposal for the staged development of an aged care and retirement village, including a medical centre, has been lodged for 62-94 Jacksons Road, Mulgrave.
- » A planning permit was issued for development of an aged care facility at 161-171 Jells Road, Wheelers Hill. The applicant is seeking an amendment to reduce the bedsits, increase building height and parking and vary setbacks.
- » An application has been made to VCAT against Council's refusal to issue a planning permit for development and use of a six storey building at 73-75 Kingsway Glen Waverley.

kindergarten provider from 2021

Kindergarten provider bestchance has decided to cease its early years service in Monash from 2020, leaving 18 community based kindergartens without a service manager.

Council is extremely disappointed with the decision. Other kindergartens across the state are also impacted with bestchance announcing it will no longer provide management for around 34 kindergarten services across the eastern region. bestchance has advised Council that it will not continue managing the service as it is no longer seen as core business in Monash.

bestchance operates the 18 kindergarten services in Monash under a service agreement with the Department of Education and Training. Council does not run the kindergarten service.

Council's only involvement is operating the central enrolment process and providing buildings to bestchance at a peppercorn rental. The operation of the service, employment of staff and financial management all sits with bestchance.

Council had already been in discussion with bestchance about its provision of service at one local kindergarten and is disappointed that bestchance did not advise earlier of its change in direction for the service.

To be told so close to the end of the kindergarten year and with so little warning is understandably disappointing and unsettling for our Monash families.

bestchance has agreed to continue the service in Monash for all 18 kindergartens until the end of 2020. This provides some short-term certainty for families and buys Council some time to find an alternative provider. There is considerable work to be done but Council and the Department of Education and Training are working together to find a new Early Years Service provider.

Council's priority is to provide certainty that a secure and viable service will be provided in Monash in the future and that there will be minimal disruption for families.

However, what this decision by bestchance has revealed is that the provision of kindergarten services is changing and we must as a community adapt to this change.

This may mean changes for how kindergarten services are offered in the future in Monash. A review of the demand for the services and the service model will be undertaken to consider how best to ensure that all families can access kindergarten services locally.

Council is not currently an early years' manager and does not intend to take on this role as there are other providers more suited to deliver kindergarten services.

New hub for Monash youth

An exciting new co-located office space for Monash Youth Services (MYS) and Wavecare will open in the New Year.

Located at level one of the Euneva building, the new space will open from Tuesday 28 January 2020 and is just 200m from Glen Waverley Station making it a central point for these important services in the heart of Glen Waverley.

With Link Health and Community operating from the ground floor of Euneva, this change creates improved accessibility to a health and wellbeing hub for young people and the wider community seeking these services. The new space was co-designed with young people, for young people, providing a more engaging and welcoming space for Monash youth.

It's a place where young people can come together in a safe environment to hang out, learn, share and connect and includes a chill space with a drop down movie screen, an outdoor terrace, kitchen, office space and private support and consulting rooms.

All existing services who currently outpost at MYS will also be moving across to the new location.

As part of the move, Monash Youth Services will also be getting a new phone number.

Consultation on the new space was undertaken with the young people of Monash, Wavecare, LinkHealth and Community and Glen Waverley Traders Association.

The \$2.8 million project was funded by the sale of the two properties where Wavecare and Monash Youth Services currently operate from.

Feasibility study for MARC

Council will undertake a feasibility study to develop and assess options for a significant redevelopment of the Monash Aquatic Recreation Centre in Glen Waverley.

The study follows a needs assessment that has been undertaken. An extensive community and stakeholder consultation was held earlier this year including surveys, staff workshops, Monash reference and advisory groups, and community focus group meetings.

Based on this consultation and the needs assessment, priorities for the redevelopment include increased warm water space, additional car parking and increased general, family and accessible change facilities.

Council is also keen to investigate providing a unique and landmark water play area, including water slides and other water activities to establish the centre as a significant aquatic and recreational facility in Victoria.

Council will seek funding options from State and Federal governments to support the redevelopment works.

A report will come before Council by June 2020 outlining a staged package of works.
