- 1. Notes the Climate Council's recent report "Game, Set, Match: Calling Time on Climate Inaction" and its key findings that:
 - Australia's summer of sport is under threat from climate change;
 - By 2040, heatwaves in Melbourne could reach highs of 50 degrees Celsius; and
 - Increasingly hot summers are a health hazard for those playing and watching sport.
